





### 7. How would you rate your involvement with A50?




### 8. Do you consider yourself a disciple - or follower - of Jesus?






## 10. Do you attend a community/Bible Study?






# **Making disciples**



## 13. Do you share the above mentioned belief and desire of the church?












## 22. Outreaches with my community

















### 25. Conferences, retreats, workshops, courses, etc. to become more equipped to share my faith




### 26. Practical assignments or challenges to go out and share my faith


#### 29. I have other ideas that would help me:



### 30. How do you rate the church in general?




## 31. What direction would you like the church to go?

### Is there anything else you would like to add, anything you missed in this survey that you want to be said?

I rate the communities of A50 not as so important. It is more just people in our church in different configurations. Much more than is sensible for this single line, but nonetheless. 1. "making disciples" is a term that I would shun, because it looks like I am doing something with the other, whereas what I would like to is that someone else sees who God is, not by my endeavour, but by God himself. I would like to inspire others to look towards God. For me, this is is a very different starting point than making them do something. Also, the wording make it seem like becoming a disciple is passive (because someone else makes you one), while I think it's actually the opposite: the one wanting to grow in following Jesus is really doing the active part (ignoring the God-does-it-actually bit), and the one 'making' disciples is supporting the other. Something like coach, supporter, facilitator or trainer (in case of a workshop) would be more apt - someone who wants to support a disciple to grow, cares, helps one to find out what and how one needs, can offer advice, pray, etc. Or giving a training or workshop or sharing insight and experience, when that is what a number of disciples would like to receive. 2. I feel both equipped (as something that happend in the past) and not equipped (as I find that something doesn't work) to help people become lifelong followers of Jesus. 3. To be a follower of Jesus can mean a lot of different, perhaps even (seemingly) conflicting, things. 4. I might come and talk anyway. 5. This is a continuation of a second half that was submitted a couple of hours before. 6. Nice questionnaire, I'm curious what comes out :) yes: in question nr. 31: the direction I would like to have the church go is the vertical direction (Jesus as foundation and Jesus as top and Jesus all through) You go girl! Haha You're great neelke! ;-) Question 31: I would like to see the church more ingrained in the culture around us -Dutch/European. I would also love to see more opportunities for all the different cultural backgrounds to be expressed. I think the church is very American in it's teaching, biblical approach and worship songstyle. I chose to go for a very broad definition; however in some questions you seem to refer to a more specific part of discipleship, e.g. "making disciples", which by the MC options seem to refer solely to evangelism and not to the ongoing process of growing as a disciple. That however is an interpretation based on the MC options and not on the specificity of the question; others may interpret the question differently. Anyways, sorry for writing so much. Hope you didn't fall asleep while reading all this:) not at the moment! Become more international, because it is Amsterdam. 'My house shall be a house of prayer for all the nations.' A50 is and hopefully will continue to be so. Nope, goed bezigl:) Thoughts on question #31: A50 is international now. I think we should stay international but do a better job of being more welcoming and sensitive to Dutch people who are more comfortable speaking Dutch.
